Best Ways to Fundraise for OCE

2. **School-Based Fundraisers** – Organize a **donation drive, student raffle, or “adopt-a-classroom” campaign.**
3. **Business & Corporate Sponsorships** – Reach out to **local businesses for funding, matching gifts, or sponsorships.**
4. **Community Events** – Host a **small fundraiser, trivia night, bake sale, or donation-based fitness class.**
5. **Peer-to-Peer Fundraising** – Challenge **10 friends** to donate \$10 each and **watch the impact grow!**

Corporate & Employee Giving

- Check if employers offer **matching donation programs**.
- Connect with HR departments at large businesses to **include OCE in corporate giving programs**.

What to Include in the Report:

- **Date & Type of Fundraiser/Outreach Event**
- **Total Funds Raised & Method of Collection** (Online, checks, etc.)
- **Number of People Reached** (If applicable)
- **Any Challenges or Success Stories**

This helps OCE **track progress, recognize volunteers, and refine fundraising strategies.**

Section 8: School Outreach Guide – Connecting with Educators & Schools

Volunteers can introduce OCE to teachers and schools to expand support.

Step 1: Identifying Schools to Connect With

- Start with **schools you're familiar with** (your children's school, your alma mater, etc.).
- Focus on **schools with high needs** or those that **lack access to extra funding.**
- Contact **teachers, principals, and PTA leaders** to introduce OCE.

- **Promote the Event** using flyers, social media, and community boards.
- **Have a Clear Fundraising Goal** and easy donation options.

Step 3: Execute & Follow Up

- Share OCE's mission and how funds will be used.

- Encourage attendees to **sign up for OCE's email list**.
- Submit a **Tracking & Reporting Form** to OCE (see Section 7).

Section 11: Civic Engagement & Education Policy Awareness

Oklahoma Citizens for Education (OCE) is a nonpartisan, 501(c)(3) organization dedicated to strengthening public education through community connection, listening, and informed dialogue. We do not endorse candidates, political parties, or specific legislation.

While OCE itself does not engage in political campaigning, we believe it is important for volunteers to understand how education policy works and how informed, respectful civic engagement can contribute to stronger schools and communities.

Why Civic Engagement Matters

Education policies influence classroom resources, teacher support systems, and student services. Understanding how these decisions are made helps communities better support educators and students and participate thoughtfully in public conversations about education.

Ways Individuals Stay Engaged & Informed

Volunteers may choose to engage in civic life in their personal capacity, separate from OCE, by:

- Learning how education policy decisions are made at the local and state level
- Attending school board or community meetings to stay informed
- Participating in community discussions about education challenges and opportunities
- Writing letters or opinion pieces that share personal experiences related to education
- Sharing credible data, research, and stories to raise awareness about education issues

Using Social Media Responsibly

Social media can be a powerful tool for education and awareness. When posting about education topics:

- Share facts, data, and personal experiences
- Avoid endorsing candidates or political parties
- Focus on the impact education has on students, families, and communities
- Encourage respectful, constructive dialogue

Education-Focused Conversation Themes

The following themes are commonly discussed in public education conversations and may be helpful when engaging in community dialogue:

- Supporting educators strengthens communities
- Teacher retention and morale are essential to student success
- Students thrive when classrooms are well-resourced
- Education outcomes affect workforce readiness and long-term economic health

Section 12: Understanding Communication with Elected Officials

Elected officials at the local and state level represent their constituents and are often interested in hearing directly from community members about their experiences and concerns.

OCE encourages volunteers to understand how government works and how education decisions are shaped, while recognizing that any communication with elected officials is done as an individual, not on behalf of Oklahoma Citizens for Education.

Having Respectful, Informed Conversations

When individuals choose to communicate with elected officials about education, constructive conversations often include:

- Sharing personal experiences with schools or classrooms
- Asking questions about education priorities and processes
- Listening to different perspectives
- Keeping discussions focused on students, educators, and community outcomes

OCE's role remains focused on:

- Gathering and sharing data and insights
- Elevating educator and community voices
- Hosting nonpartisan conversations and forums
- Supporting informed, respectful dialogue around education

Section 13: How to Engage Businesses & Corporate Sponsors

- 4. Connect with OCE for Resources** – Receive guidance, training, and materials from the OCE team.

5. **Host Your First Fundraiser or Awareness Event** – Start small and build momentum!
